Treat workers fairly in accordance with labor rights standards both at national and international levels and use raw materials from legal sources that are traceable in every supply chain.



By applying **Indonesian Sustainable Palm Oil (ISPO)** standard, certified plantation companies and smallholders are entitled to use the ISPO logo, showing that they have complied with Government Regulations and meet the criteria of responsible producers.

In the new ISPO, the plantation companies and oil palm planters that are ISPO certified **have been verified** by an independent third party and are accredited by a national accreditation agency that has received recognition from an international accreditation forum.



This strengthened governance has displayed the strong commitment of Indonesia through the new ISPO to which is comparable with RSPO standard. **Thus, market acceptance of the new ISPO is hopefully to be increased along with global recognition on ISPO standard.**
